

**REACHING RURAL CANCER SURVIVORS WHO SMOKE USING TEXT-BASED CESSATION INTERVENTIONS**

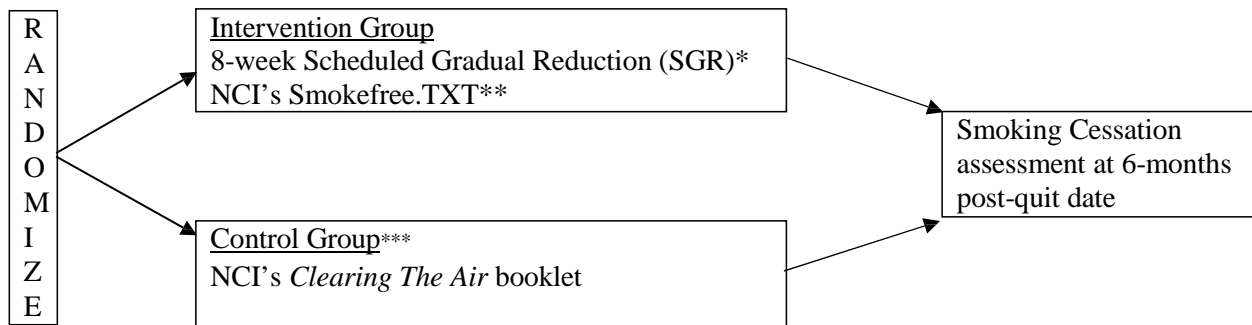
**Eligibility Criteria (see Section 3.2)**

- Have a cancer diagnosis within the past 10 years, and can currently be receiving curative treatment (See §3.2.1)
- Participant not currently on hospice (See §3.2.2)
- Currently smokes ≥ 5 cigarettes daily (See §3.2.3)
- Participant lives in a nonmetro/rural county (See §3.2.4)
- Interested in participating in a smoking cessation program and not currently participating in a smoking cessation trial (See §3.2.5).
- Not using any smoking cessation pharmacotherapy, or participating in any smoking cessation program at the time of enrollment (See §3.2.6)
- Participant has a cell or smart phone device with texting ability (See §3.2.7)
- Participant must be able to speak and read English (See §3.2.8)
- Age ≥ 18 years
- Participant must be willing to provide urine sample (See §3.2.10)
- Patients with impaired decision-making capacity are not eligible for this study (See §3.2.11).

### 3.2 On-Study Guidelines

This clinical trial can fulfill its objectives only if patients appropriate for this trial are enrolled. All relevant medical and other considerations should be taken into account when deciding whether this protocol is appropriate for a particular patient. Physicians should consider the risks and benefits of any therapy, and therefore only enroll patients for whom this treatment is appropriate.

Physicians should consider whether any of the following may render the patient inappropriate for this protocol:

- Psychiatric illness which would prevent the patient from giving informed consent.

### 3.3 Eligibility Criteria

- \_\_\_ 3.2.1 Have a cancer diagnosis within the past 10 years, and can currently be receiving curative treatment.

- \_\_\_ 3.2.3 Currently smokes  $\geq 5$  cigarettes daily
- Note:** Participants who vape are eligible.
- \_\_\_ 3.2.4 Lives in a nonmetro/rural county (defined as having a Rural Urban Continuum Code (RUCC) code of 4-9)[39]. The RUCC code can be checked at: <https://www.ruralhealthinfo.org/am-i-rural>.
- \_\_\_ 3.2.5 Patient interested in participating in a smoking cessation program, and not currently participating in a smoking cessation clinical trial
- \_\_\_ 3.2.6 Not currently using any smoking cessation pharmacotherapy (e.g., Nicotine Replacement Therapy, bupropion or varenicline), or currently participating in any cessation program at the time of enrollment.
- \_\_\_ 3.2.7 Patient has a cell phone or smart phone device with texting ability
- \_\_\_ 3.2.8 **Language:** In order to complete the mandatory patient-completed measures, participants must be able to speak and read English.
- \_\_\_ 3.2.9 Age  $\geq 18$  years
- \_\_\_ 3.2.10 Participant must be willing to provide a urine sample.
- \_\_\_ 3.2.11 Patients with impaired decision-making capacity are not eligible for this study.
